The Sister René Dental Center also celebrated spring with some exciting changes this year. The Dental Center not only received a "make over", but also welcomed a new dentist, William S. Veazey, DMD. He joined the Dental Center to enable St. James Mercy to meet the needs of the community for high-quality, accessible dental care, particularly in our underserved populations.

Dr. Veazey was born in Clarksdale, Mississippi, attended Delta State University and received his doctorate degree in dentistry from the University of Mississippi School of Dentistry. He completed his

General Practice Residency at the Naval Medical Center in San Diego and at Erie County Medical Center.

Dr. Veazey is a member of the American Dental Education Association and American Association for Dental Research. He also has professional interests in various types of research; these include developing regenerative medicine-specific therapies, instrumentation and techniques, and invention and creative thinking in biomedical research.

# Forte Gamma Nuclear Camera

St. James Mercy Health System has acquired a unique new imaging system from Philips Medical Systems that expands diagnostic and screening capabilities by using a dual-head nuclear medicine gamma camera. With the new Forte JetStream-acquisition system, we can obtain more advanced clinical images that may help lead to potentially life-saving treatment options or rule out serious medical conditions. It is much faster than our old equipment and provides easy patient access, with the ability to scan patients who are on stretchers, beds or wheelchairs, which also leads to improved patient comfort. The powerful nuclear imaging method provides exceptionally detailed visualization of deep activity within the body, particularly effective in cardiac, brain and some oncology applications.

"We are very pleased to be able to offer our patients this important advancement in diagnostic imaging," said C. Susan Wesley, MD, Senior Vice President for Medical Affairs. "With access to a superior picture of a heart, lung, kidney or bone, the studies are easier to read and the higher resolution produces a better image that increases accuracy. Additionally, we will now have the ability to do nuclear stress tests using the new Cardio Trac technology." St. James Mercy is pleased to offer this important improvement in healthcare so their patients will no longer find it necessary to travel out of town for services that can now be performed locally.



## New OR High Definition Imaging

Early in the fall, St. James Mercy was proud to be the first hospital in the area to introduce a high definition universal imaging system for use in endoscopic and laproscopic procedures. According to Dr. Joseph McCormick, "with this expertise, we are definitely ahead of the curve and leading the pack."

The technology allows a common platform to be used for endoscopic observation and minimally invasive surgery such as colonoscopies, upper gastrointestinal endoscopies, bronchoscopies and laproscopies. The system gives surgeons the ability to view images in a higher resolution, and with a higher level of detail and color than before, enabling them to see abnormalities they might have missed before, helping to facilitate diagnosis. "Increasing patient safety is a major concern in delivering surgical care," added Dr. A. Byron Collins. He also stated, "This new technology, providing increased clarity of images, will have a positive impact for our patients."

According to Dr. Thomas Foreman, the new machine will help prevent the development of colon cancer through early detection. "Polyps are much easier to see now and therefore remove. "Left alone, polyps will develop into cancer. The more precise you are at removing the polyps, the better chance you have of saving a patient from a colon tumor."

## Long Term Care – McAuley Manor

The Social Work and Activity Departments joined together in January of 2006 to form Residential Life Services. The staff of this new department, under the Direction of Kelly Bracken, BSW, is leading a culture change in the nursing home that begins with enhancing the quality of activity programs through a "person-centered" approach.

In anticipation of this "culture change", we hired Amber Bob, Recreational Therapist. Amber brings long term care experience that will enhance our efforts to provide activities that promote increased mental and psychosocial well-being for our residents. Our activity aides: Rose Acor, Dawn Evans and Jen Carney, are attending the MEPAP (Modular Education Program for Activity Professionals) Course and will be Certified Activity Assistants in the spring of 2007.

This department is also supported by Jennifer Koehler and Brian Diffenbacher, Social Workers who lead the interdisciplinary team toward our goal of a more resident centered and home-like atmosphere at McAuley Manor at MercyCare.

## Mercy Suite offers a special place for families in times of need

In March of 2005, St. James Mercy Health System first opened the doors to the St. James Mercy Suite. We thank St. James Mercy employee, Linda Campese, for recognizing the growing need for a special room to be set aside in the hospital to provide care for terminally ill patients and their families.

Funding for the Mercy Suite project was made available through the St. James Mercy Foundation. Many of the items and equipment used in the Mercy Suite, as well as monetary contributions, have been donated to honor loved ones; and for this we give thanks.

Since its creation, there have been over fifty patients and their families who have known the comfort of the Mercy Suite. Lisa Green-Preston and family recently donated a double size hospital bed, fitted with coordinating linens, and comforter; so family members could have the opportunity to hold and comfort their loved one in a larger bed without causing the patient undue discomfort in the process. On December 28, 2006, Mercy Suite was officially dedicated in the loving memory of Stephen Terry for the contributions he made throughout his life to St.

## St. James Mercy a Tobacco-Free Campus

On November 16, 2006, the national "Great American Smoke-Out" day, St. James Mercy Health System joined with hospitals from the Rochester Region and the Southern Tier to become an entirely smoke/tobacco-free campus. This new policy applies to all St. James Mercy employees, patients, visitors, students, trainees, volunteers and vendors.

Since January 2006, a smoking cessation committee, comprised of managers and staff within the system, met regularly to keep St. James Mercy focused on the implementation of this important goal. Smoking cessation classes were offered to support employees trying to quit, along with a NYS Smokers' Quitline (1-866-NY-Quits) and website [www.nysmokefree.com](http://www.nysmokefree.com) developed by New York State.

"As the healthcare leader in our community, we have an obligation to take the lead in providing a healthy environment for our patients, visitors and employees," stated Brian O'Hearn, Sr. Vice President for Patient Care.



## Dialysis Unit at Mercycare

Dialysis treatment is one of the broad array of services provided by St. James Mercy Health System. Dialysis is a life-sustaining treatment for persons who suffer from chronic kidney failure. The dialysis unit is located at Mercycare and currently services sixty patients within an 80 mile radius. The unit has one patient who has received dialysis treatment for eighteen years. The youngest patient started treatment at the age of 21 and has been coming for twelve years.

In October, the Mercycare Dialysis Unit was written up in a national publication of the American Medical Directors' Association, highlighting the progressive aspect of a long term care facility having an in-house dialysis unit. There are twelve residents of McAuley Manor who are on dialysis. Not only is the in-house resident's quality of life improved, but "the biggest benefit has been the fact that we don't need to transport our residents to receive treatment, which most facilities really struggle with," according to Theresa Bracken, R.N., Director of Nursing.

Thanks to the generosity of the community and the support of the St. James Mercy Foundation, twelve new dialysis machines were purchased this year; making treatments easier with fewer side effects, thus leading to the number one goal of improved quality of life and an overall sense of well-being for our dialysis patients.

# St. James Mercy Awarded Accreditation from Joint Commission

By demonstrating compliance with the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organization's (JCAHO) national standards for health care quality and safety, St. James Mercy Health System earned the Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval in 2006.

"The community should be proud that St. James Mercy is focusing on the most challenging goal; to continuously raise quality and safety to higher levels," says Darlene Christiansen, Executive Director, Hospital Accreditation Program, Joint Commission. The Joint Commission conducted an unannounced, on-site evaluation of St. James Mercy Health System on July 11-14, 2006.



The award of accreditation recognizes St. James Mercy's dedication to comply with the Joint Commission's state-of-the-art standards on a continuous basis.

The JCAHO survey was not only conducted at the hospital but also at physician offices, MercyCare Addiction Treatment Center of Hornell (MATCH) and Aquinas day treatment program. "St. James Mercy's accreditation achievement is a demonstration of the organization's leadership and staff commitment to excellence," says Mary Cesare-Murphy, Ph.D., Executive Director, Behavioral Health Care Accreditation Program, Joint Commission.

## Behavioral Health Services Welcomes New VP

Behavioral Health Services at St. James Mercy had a highly successful year in 2006. Every program went through major changes that were designed to improve the quality and effectiveness of care for our patients. Common among all programs was the hiring and upgrading of licensed professional staff, new program leadership, physical plant improvements, the quality of clinical programming, and improvements in documentation. Service delivery was revamped to be more patient-centered, and substantial efforts were made to improve and develop more cooperative relationships with local and regional providers.

The St. James Mercy Behavioral Health Services include:

- Inpatient Adult and Adolescent Psychiatric services for people experiencing an emotional crisis that requires hospitalization, located in the main hospital;
- Aquinas Continuing Day Treatment for patients suffering from chronic mental illness, located in the former Lincoln School; and
- MercyCare Addiction Treatment Center of Hornell (MATCH) Inpatient and Outpatient Alcoholism and Substance Abuse services, located in North Hornell at MercyCare.

Also in August 2006, St. James Mercy welcomed Joe Willson as the new Vice President for Behavioral Health Services.

## CHE Patient Satisfaction Awards

St. James Mercy Health System continually strives to meet and exceed the needs and expectations of those we serve. Catholic Health East rewards and recognizes excellence in patient/resident satisfaction on a quarterly basis, which is consistent with the principles of Values in Practice. There are two types of recognition awarded: the Golden Service Excellence Award, which recognizes those facilities with the highest score; and the Silver Service Excellence Award, which recognizes those with the most improved scores.

St. James Mercy was very honored and pleased to have earned three of these awards in 2006. We received the Golden Service Award for our Emergency Department and we received the Silver Award twice for our Behavioral Health Services. We commend our staff for their ongoing dedication and commitment to those we serve.

## New Cataract Treatment – Aqualase Eye Procedure

St. James Mercy Health System is one of the early sites in the United States to begin using Alcon's Infilanti™ Vision System – a new surgical cataract removal instrument that offers the option to use naturally balanced fluid media to break up and "wash away" eye lenses clouded by cataracts. A cataract is a clouding of the eye's lens that can cause vision problems. Standard cataract surgery involves removing the cloudy lens and replacing it with an artificial lens. This new procedure was introduced at St. James Mercy in August, 2006.

The Infilanti Vision System, the world's first tri-modal lens removal surgical instrument, gives surgeons more advanced alternative methods to remove a cataract.

Lens removal is now safer and more effective. This new technology increases flexibility and incorporates more options for the surgeons and also provides them greater control over the lens removal procedure, which offers the reduced risk of complications. According to ophthalmologist Dr. Allan Robbins, this new procedure takes approximately six minutes and the patient is able to drive and work the following day. If it is necessary to perform surgery on both eyes, the surgeries are scheduled at least two weeks apart.

"I am excited about this new fluid-based cataract removal system," said Allan Robbins, MD. "We are committed to providing our patients with the best care available and believe this system will enhance our ability to do that."

## Tradition of Serving the Community Continues

St James Mercy Health System was established to meet the community health needs identified by the founder, Fr. James Early, and the Sisters of Mercy, the first caregivers and administrators of the hospital. The scope and complexity of the health needs have changed over the years, but one thing has not changed: the Mission of St. James Mercy continues to

focus on the needs of the rural poor and underserved populations of the Southern Tier.
